The Twin Sin:

- 1) Rebellion against God.
- 2) A redefinition of Good and Evil

*The late Dr. Larry Hurtado, historian of early Christianity, in his wildly celebrated book **Destroyer of the Gods**, Told the story of how a tiny Jewish sect of Jesus followers overcame the bastion of paganism and won over the Roman Empire in only a few centuries.*

*His thesis was that it wasn't the churches relevance or relatability to the culture but it's **difference and distinctness** that made it compelling to so many. The church was marked by five distinctive features, all of which made it stand out against the backdrop of the empire.*

5 Distinctive Features of the Early Church.



1. The church was multiracial and multiethnic, with a high value for diversity, equity, and inclusion.

2. The church was spread across socioeconomic lines as well, and there was a high value for caring for the poor: those with extra were expected to share with those with less.

3. It was staunch in its active resistance to infanticide and abortion.

4. It was resolute in its vision of marriage and sexuality as between one man and one woman for life.

5. It was nonviolent, both on a personal level and a political level.

Tertullian remarked that Non Christians would look at Christians and say, “look how they love one another and how they are ready to die for each other. There is something extraordinary about the way that they care for the poor, conduct

their business and restrain their sexual appetites. These people don't abandon their babies on the streets (as was common in that day), But pick them up and Care for them, husbands and wives have sex only with each other (unlike the Greek double standard of demanding a

*faithful wife but allowing men to have courtesans and concubines for pleasure and slaves for their “daily needs.” These people are different. **It was not Christian worship that attracted outsiders it was Christians who attracted them.***

As you consider whom you will nominate to represent your network on Kingdom Network Global Board (KNGB), we share two ideas that hopefully will help you in this process. The first idea is

Jesus's vision for leadership. Jesus tells us that worldly leadership is marked by control and power. Jesus redefines leadership for his followers. For him, **leadership is servanthood and sacrifice.**

The second idea is the **necessity of biblical diversity**. While explaining how the church is a body that functions when each part of the body functions, Paul writes, “God has so composed the

body, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body... (v.24-25)". Here, Paul reimagines who receives honor; he challenges us concerning who gets a seat at the

table. In God's economy, a place of honor is given to the overlooked and undervalued parts. This "greater honor" ensures that the whole body is healthy, as Jesus intends.

6. We are a movement that is passionate about embodying the great vision of heaven found in the book of Revelation, “every tribe, tongue and nation”. we promise to partner with God to see this come about.

7. We are growing as people of love. this movement is based upon Christ-centered friendships that encourage us to stay faithful, accountable and that will work to see all our churches thrive.
